- 1) Please attach a copy of your professional resume** (include your GPA, major(s), minor(s) and your hometown).
- 2) Community Service** – Please describe, **in 500 words or less**, your community service efforts within the Northwestern community and elsewhere during your time in college, dedicating a few sentences to each activity to explain what you did and for how long. If you are a freshman, feel free to refer to your high school experiences.
- 3) Leadership** – Please list all leadership positions you have held within the Northwestern community and elsewhere during your time in college. If you are a freshman, you can refer to your high school experiences.
- 4) Financial Need** – Please write a **250-word** statement explaining your financial need and what the scholarship would pay for. Also, provide your internship's contact information to verify information provided.
- 5) Personal Essay** – In **500 words or less**, please describe your summer service project/internship, why you chose it, and what you hope to gain from it as you continue your academic and professional career.
- 6) Link(s) to information about the program or organization you will be volunteering with.**

If you are chosen as a recipient for the scholarship, you will be required to send a follow-up report/summary about your summer experience (photos/videos highly encouraged). We will provide more information by the end of Spring Quarter.
